## **Tutor Tips**

We adults like to give right answers to questions. Your adult students want to give you right answers, but may not know the English words (vocabulary), may not understand the question (comprehension), may hear

something different from what you said (pronunciation), may remember how bad they felt when they made a mistake in school (past experience), or may be scared stiff of this new country, culture, or situation (fear of unknown).

In fact, ironically, making mistakes is the way we learn, right? Think of how you learned to ride a bike or drive a car or organize a family gathering!

As we try to build trust and comfort with our adult students, we need to give them every opportunity to "give the right answer." That means taking the time to clarify the slightest misunderstanding of a new word. That means listening, *really* listening to your student, and trying your darndest (using translator apps, pictures, hand and body movements, etc.) to help them understand something meaningful to them. And, it means having them leave each session with a feeling of mastery of at least one new concept/vocabulary word and its usage/spoken phrase. Repetition will reinforce this in their adult brain, and their feeling of success will build their confidence.


